RESOLUTION NO. 2024-08A DECLARING AUGUST 31, 2024 AS OVERDOSE AWARENESS DAY



WHEREAS, International Overdose Awareness Day is a global event that is held on August 31st of each year to remember those gone too soon from overdose deaths; and

WHEREAS, like many counties, Randolph County is fighting concurrent epidemics – while prescription opioids are driving deaths in rural areas, illicit opioid drugs are the primary drivers of deaths in suburban and urban areas; and

WHEREAS, the Randolph County Commission encourages communities to develop and support local coalitions because this epidemic looks different in various parts of the world, and local engagement and leadership is imperative; and

WHEREAS, culture changes happens in neighborhoods and local communities, and localities play a major role in assisting with the removal of the stigma of addiction and the normalization of recovery; and

WHEREAS, dedicated treatment providers work tirelessly to help individuals with substand use disorders recover; and

WHEREAS, addiction is not a moral failing but a complex and treatable disease, and a life of recovery is possible; and

WHEREAS, International Overdose Awareness Day is an opportunity for all Randolph County citizens to stand beside those who have lost loved ones to an overdose and those who have a substance use disorder and are diligently working toward recovery;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Randolph County Commission hereby proclaims August 31, 2024, as "Overdose Awareness Day" in Randolph County, and commends its observance to all citizens.


